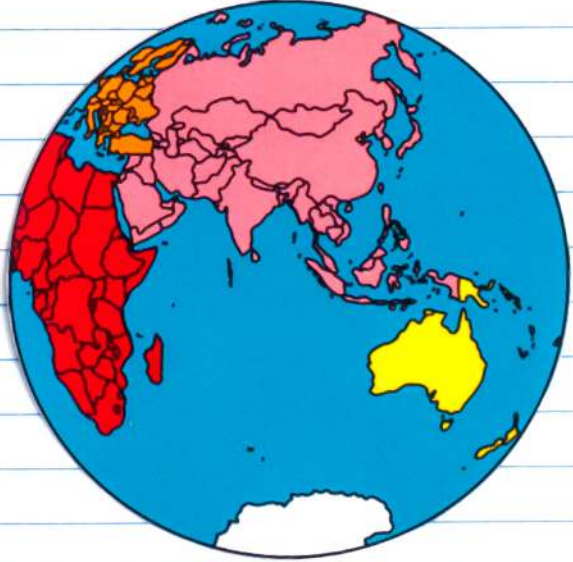

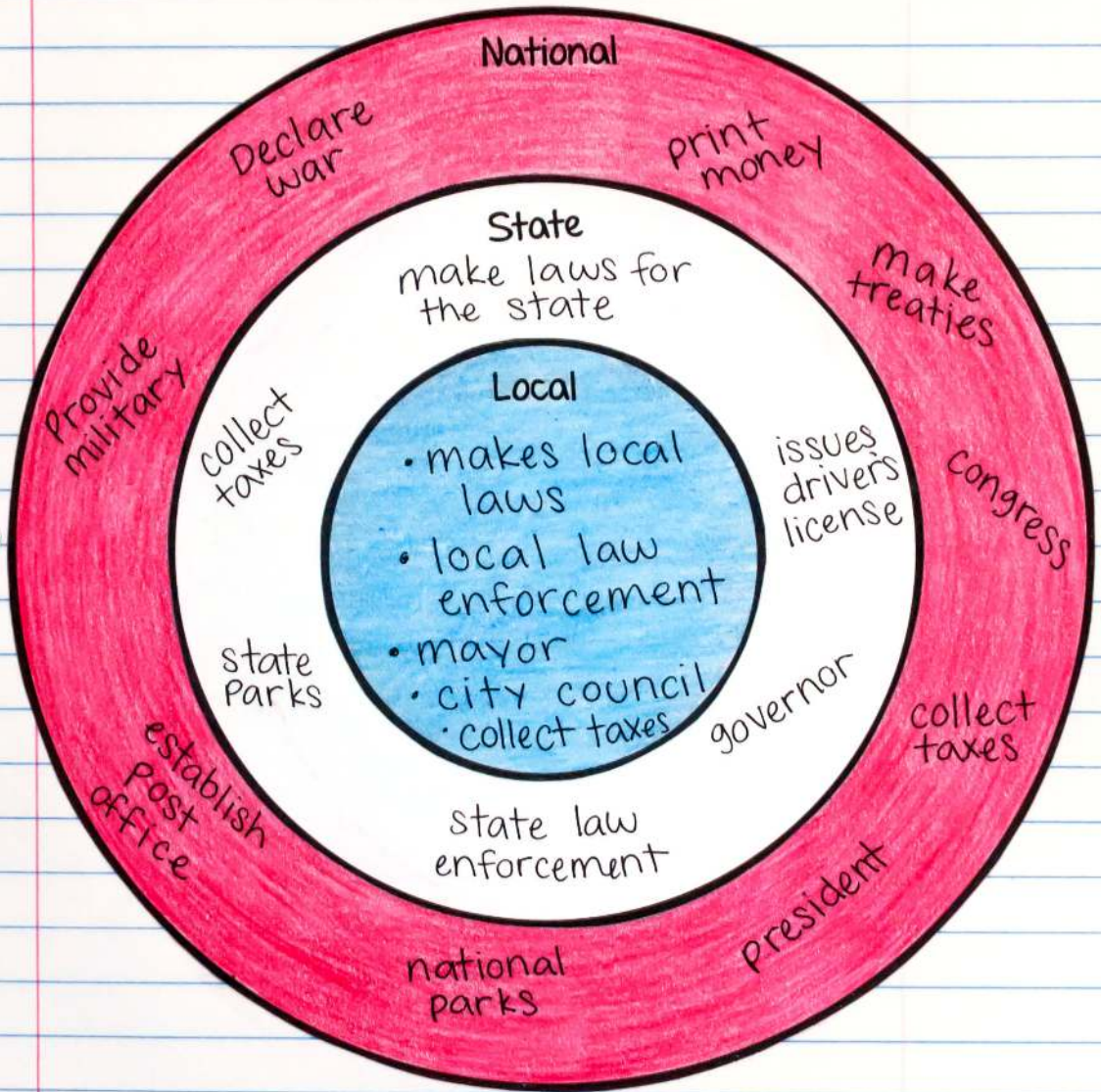

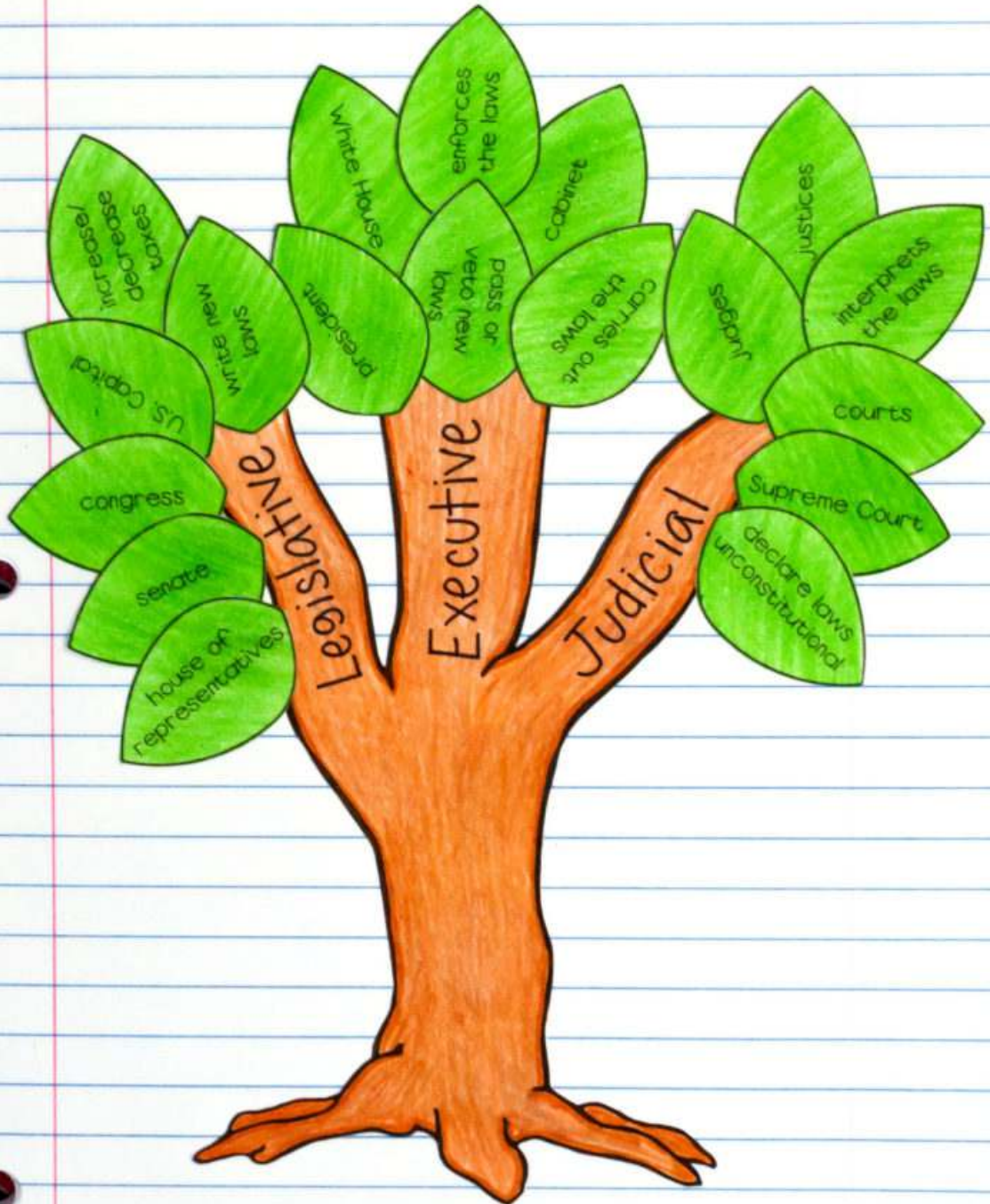

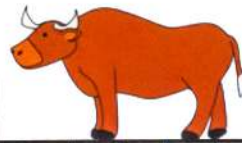

MAJOR BATTLES OF THE REVOLUTIONARY WAR



FORT TICONDEROGA

Less than a month after Lexington, American troops captured Ft. Ticonderoga and eventually drove the British out of Boston.

BATTLE OF BUNKER HILL

Fought on Breed's Hill outside of Boston. The British won but paid a heavy toll and became much more cautious.

THE CAMPAIGN IN NEW YORK

Major defeat for Americans who were new soldiers at the time and panicked in a series of battles.

TRENTON & PRINCETON

Washington and army crossed the Delaware on Christmas eve and captured more than 900 Hessian troops and 1200 weapons without losing a single man.

BATTLE AT SARATOGA

Americans defeated the British in two battles with 6,000 men surrendering. This caused the French to enter the war.

YORKTOWN

French + American armies converged on Yorktown and hemmed in the British army. Cornwallis and 8,000 men surrendered.

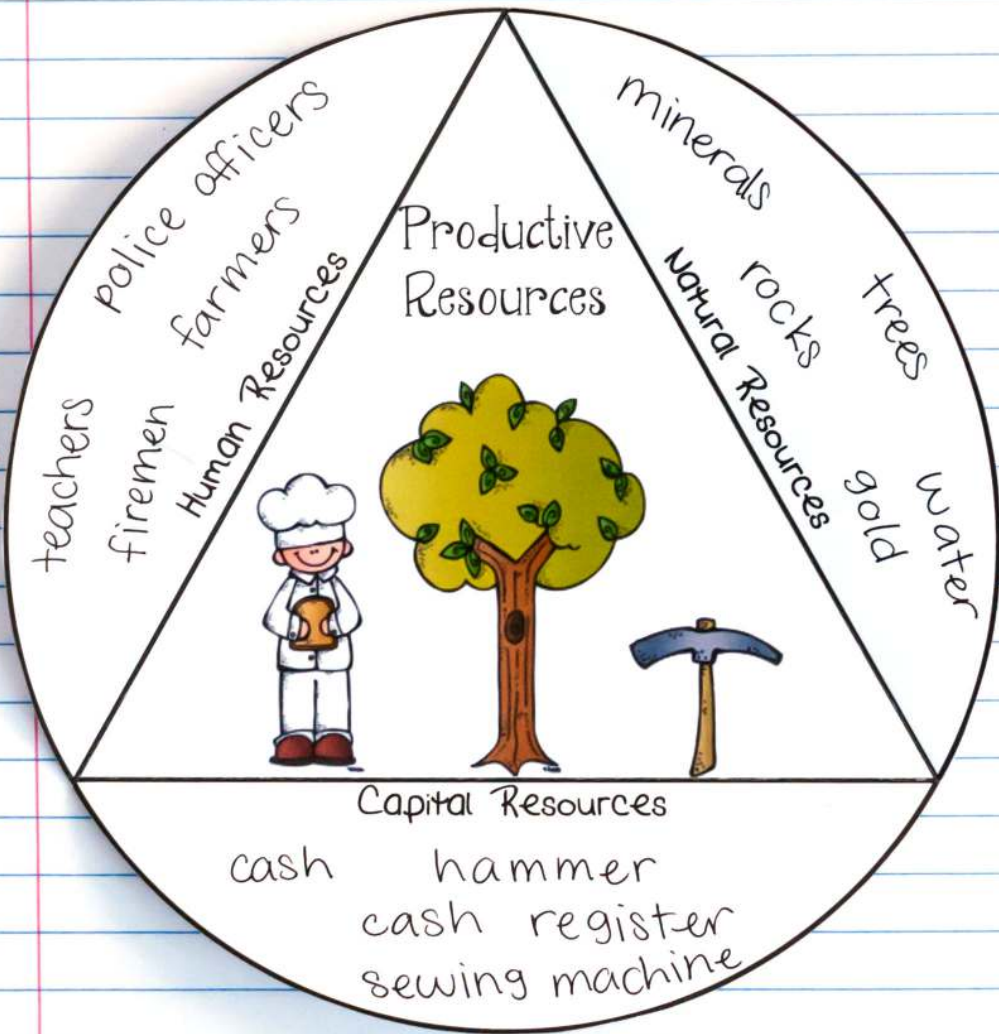
