#### DIGITAL & PHYSICAL VERSION DIRECTIONS

- Clue I-Print the Clue I puzzle cards on cardstock and laminate (one set for each group). Store the
  cut out cards in a baggie and place the baggie inside the large envelope.
- Clue 2-Print the Clue 2 social skills cards on cardstock and laminate (one set for each group). Store
  the cut out cards in a baggie and place the baggie inside the large envelope. You may either print the
  l-page recording sheet or 2-page recording sheet. When finished writing responses, students should
  bring their recording sheet to you. If you approve of their responses, give students the Clue 2
  maze, which will give them the 3-digit number combination.
- Clue 3-Print one copy for each group. Store these in the large envelope. Students must find
  members of their group who have completed the activities. Students have a BINGO when they have
  5 in a row, column, or diagonally. When they have a BINGO, give students the Clue 3 code, which will
  give them their five color combination.
- Clue 4-Print one copy for each group. This is available in an editable version where you can adapt the
  choices to your classroom. In the answer key, I have highlighted the answer choices that will work
  with the letter combination included in the directions.
- In the digital version, rather than having students unlock locks, they should answer on the included
  Google Form. This will allow students to progress forward only if they answer correctly.


